STABLES THEATRE - COUNCIL OF MANAGEMENT

Members of the Stables Council of Management have been working hard all through both periods of lockdown and are now happy to be in the position where we are ready to open the Theatre again "normally". Meetings were made by Zoom during lockdown and we are now pleased to say that we are back to meeting in the Theatre.

The Council of Management is responsible for all aspects of running, preserving and maintaining the Theatre.

The Council of Management is made up of members who are elected at the Annual General Meeting *i.e.* the Chair, two Vice-Chairs, Hon. Treasurer and Hon. Secretary being elected annually and six ordinary members every two years (with an option to serve a further two years).

The Council meets once a month to deal with matters arising, new projects and general ongoing business. Council minutes are available for members to view on request to the Secretary.

Each member of the Council is responsible for a specific area of the Theatre *i.e.* backstage, legal, art gallery, box office, IT, printing, design, marketing, house and grounds, wardrobe *etc.* The licensee of the Theatre is a member of the Council.

As the Covid threat recedes we are gradually coming out of the restrictions imposed due to social distancing *etc*. First productions had very small casts and crew and have now, at last, got to the stage where we are looking forward and excited to be presenting our first Stables production since March 2019!

We hope you are all well.

The council are very aware that there is a group of members who do not have access to the internet and are sorry that we have not been able to communicate with them as effectively as with other members.

We have also made a survey of local theatres and theatre groups and predominantly everyone is returning to 100% capacity with limited Covid restrictions.

The Stables Theatre has decided

- To return to 100% capacity, with the online booking facility re-opening.

- That we will encourage the wearing of masks when moving around the building; but we are happy for audience members to continue to wear masks throughout the performance if they wish to. We understand that this is not enforceable.
- Theatre staff will wear masks and we will keep box office screens.
- As a trial we are making Monday 20th September a socially distanced and mask wearing event.
 Please if you do not wish to wear a mask then do not book for the performance on this date. There will be table service in the bar for this performance. Tickets for this performance can only be purchased by telephone or in person If this proves successful then we may repeat it for other Stables Theatre productions.

NEW WRITING SUBMISSIONS

The Stables has recognised a need to further support writers and so we have created a more defined process for submitting plays to the theatre.

The Stables will now accept play submissions twice a year – in March and September. March submissions will be part of our on-going New Play Writing Competition. Any new play which has never been produced before, and meets our rules, is eligible.

And in September we will accept <u>any</u> play written by you and that meets our rules, even if the play has been performed previously.

Full rules are now available on our website. We believe this new process will make it more transparent for playwrights who want to get their work in front of an audience. We look forward to reading some amazing new scripts!

CONCESSIONS

Following consultation with local groups the Stables now offers a free membership for people with a disability.

This membership will allow the qualifying individual to buy their ticket, and their carer's ticket at membership prices for that event/ performance. Both tickets must be purchased at the same time.

To qualify for this Stables concession you must be in receipt of and provide evidence for one of the following benefits:-

- Disability Living Allowance
- Personal Independence Payment
- Registered Blind

You will need to register at the box office for this membership before purchasing show tickets.

Documentation must be dated within the last eight months, copies or electronic copies are acceptable.

This membership will then be on going but we will contact you annually for copies of current qualifying documentation.

Only one offer, discount or concession can be applied to each ticket sold.

BOX OFFICE - MY STORY

What a journey! 24 years ago I walked into the theatre and within 20 minutes I found myself behind the counter! I was persuaded, not that I needed much persuading, to spend a few minutes observing box office duties before deciding whether to sign up as a volunteer. Well, I'm still a volunteer, one of the many who help to keep the Stables running so successfully.

When I started there were no computers, no online bookings. Telephone bookings and face-to-face interaction with customers was the norm. But in order to survive the box office had to move forward and one of the greatest challenges for me was to learn the intricacies of the software, not once, but twice!

Very quickly I came to realise that selling tickets was not the only skill to be mastered. The box office was often the first point of contact and information so learning who was who and what was where (including the electricity meters!) was equally as important.

One nightmare job that never changes is the organisation of the box office rota, although it does offer opportunities to get to know our fellow workers. Health and family issues can occur without warning and then the rota co-ordinator has to be resourceful, or in some instances, step into the breach.

I've met a lot of talented and interesting people in all departments of the theatre, made many friends and enjoy being part of the Stables family. It's a great place to be!
