Open Auditions (all are welcome to try out)

Sunday 24 April 2022 from 2:00-4:00pm at the Stables Theatre, Hastings

Production Dates: 30 June, 01 July, 02 July (Thurs, Fri, Sat evenings) – three performances only!

Audition note: This production will have the actors mime many of the props. Therefore I would like to ask that all actors auditioning be prepared to do a very brief mime scene (10-20 seconds) of picking up an imaginary jug of water, pouring the water into an imaginary glass, picking up that imaginary glass and miming drinking the water.

Rehearsal Dates:

From 04 May onwards, typically Tuesday, Wednesday & Thursday evenings, 7:30 to 9:30pm, with occasional Sunday mornings. May be adjusted as needed.

Two weeks before opening the rehearsal days and times will be expanded.

About this play: 'The Seventh Swimmer' is a new play, making its World Première at the Stables.

Synopsis:

In 1911 London, Robert McBride is the newly appointed Assistant Dean of the progressive Battersea Polytechnic and newly married to beautiful Prussian aristocrat, Maya. Life has endless possibilities, but when Robert becomes infatuated with one of his male students, Killian, his life is thrown into turmoil. When Maya's manipulative cousin, Otto, seeks to exploit the situation for his own advantage, he triggers a chain of devastating events which prove as fatal as England's descent to war.

CHARACTERS IN 'THE SEVENTH SWIMMER':

Robert McBride - Male, late 20s, intelligent, middle-class, eager to please

Maya McBride – Female, late 20s to early 30s, wife of Robert, cousin of Otto, mix of minor British and Prussian aristocracy, a strong free-spirited woman

Killian Quinn – Male, early 20s, athletic, working-class poor, outwardly masculine but gay and comfortable with that (NOTE: role requires actor to be nude in two scenes)

Otto Von Füstenberg – Male, late 20s to late 30s, Prussian nobleman, mischievous, stooped, with a slight limp and walks with a stick (NOTE: role requires actor to do a passable German accent)

Here at Last is Love is a story so ripe for the telling, a story of kindness and humanity. It needs to be told.





Nick: Jim's monologue from The Glass Menagerie



The musical by George Stiles and Anthony Drewe (also responsible for stage versions of 'Mary Poppins' and 'The Wind in the Willows'). Based on 'The Ugly Duckling' by Hans Christian Anderson. 4 m 4 F or a few more if needed. I think its delightful and very funny. Simple music and lyrics even for non-singers. First performed at the Watermill Newbury and then transferred to Stephen Joseph Theatre in Scarborough and The National Theatre - before going around the world in over 300 productions picking up Olivier and Tony awards.

The authors and all the productions I know of never envisaged feathery body suits, masks or beaks. Where possible they thought of the human counterpart of each character and used that as a basis for both the costume design and the way in which the part is played. In the script they refer to judiciously placed baseball caps giving the impression of ducks' beaks or a set of red hair-rollers bear an uncanny resemblance to a chicken's comb. The tag line for the publicity could be 'A celebration of being different' - it would be a wonderfully fun show to be part of and to see.
