



Actress, soprano, and stage star Kitty Clive (1711-1785) had a unique command of London's theatre world of the 18th century. Born Catherine Raftor in 1711 and rising to fame as Mrs Clive, she negotiated the raucous, fastmoving, and sometimes unforgiving London scene with intelligence and grace. This show explores her world, shines a light on the vocal genres in which she excelled and celebrates the vibrancy of mid-18th century theatre performances through publications they inspired.


